Phenylketonuria (fen-ul-key-toe-NU-ree-uh), also called PKU, is a rare inherited disorder that causes an amino acid called phenylalanine to build up in the body. Autosomal recessive gene. Two Asymptomatic parients => one in 4 chance of symptomatic child + 2 in four carriers.

Phenylketonuria (PKU) is an inborn error of metabolism that results in decreased metabolism of the amino acid phenylalanine. Untreated PKU can lead to intellectual disability, seizures, behavioral problems, and mental disorders.

It is caused by mutations in the phenylalanine hydroxylase (PAH) gene. This gene helps create the enzyme needed to break down phenylalanine., which can result in inefficient or nonfunctional phenylalanine hydroxylase, an enzyme responsible for the metabolism of excess phenylalanine. This results in the buildup of dietary phenylalanine to potentially toxic levels. It is autosomal recessive, meaning that both copies of the gene must be mutated for the condition to develop. There are two main types, classic PKU and variant PKU, depending on whether any enzyme function remains. Those with one copy of a mutated gene typically do not have symptoms. Many countries have newborn screening programs for the disease.

Without the enzyme necessary to break down phenylalanine, a dangerous buildup can develop when a person with PKU eats foods that contain protein or eats aspartame, an artificial sweetener. This can eventually lead to serious health problems.

For the rest of their lives, people with PKU — babies, children and adults — need to follow a diet that limits phenylalanine, which is found mostly in foods that contain protein. Newer medications may allow some people with PKU to eat a diet that has a higher or an unrestricted amount of phenylalanine.

**Robert Leroy Bartley** (October 12, 1937 – December 10, 2003) was the editor of the editorial page of *The Wall Street Journal* for more than 30 years. He won a Pulitzer Prize for opinion writing and received the Presidential Medal of Freedom from the Bush administration in 2003. Bartley, a graduate of Iowa State University, was famed for providing a conservative interpretation of the news every day, especially regarding economic issues.<sup>[1]</sup> *The Forbes Media Guide Five Hundred, 1994* states: Editor Bartley's influence stems largely from his intelligent, fearless editorship of the *Journal's* editorial and op-ed pages.<sup>[2]</sup> Robert L. Bartley Fellowships are named in his honor

**Professional** In 1983, Bartley was named a vice president of Dow Jones & Company, owner of The Wall Street Journal. Bartley was the author of "The Seven Fat Years: And How to Dolt Again," published in 1992, a book on the economic policy of the Reagan administration.

In December 2002, Bartley stepped down as editor of the Wall Street Journal editorial page. In December 2003, a week before Bartley died of cancer, President George W. Bush announced that Bartley was being awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom, America's highest civilian honor.<sup>[8]</sup>

Toddlers Who Have Over 14 Hours Of Screen Time Weekly More Likely To Have Autism Spectrum Disorder Diagnosis When They Are 12 Years Old, Study Finds

Psychiatric News (11/6) reports research found that “toddlers who have more than 14 hours per week of screen time have nearly twice the odds of having a diagnosis of autism spectrum disorder when they are 12 years old.”

Investigators found that “children were more likely to have more than 14 hours of screen time when they were 2 years old if they were boys, their mothers had less than 13 years of education or less, or they lived in households with a family income of \$60,000 or less.” The findings were published in JAMA Pediatrics.

## **Hormone Therapy May Reduce Relapse Risk for Menopausal Age Women With Schizophrenia**

Adding menopausal hormone therapy (MHT) to antipsychotic medication can lower the risk of relapse or any psychiatric hospitalization in women between 40 and 62 years of age who have schizophrenia, according to a report in *AJP in Advance*.

“At menopausal age, antipsychotic effectiveness decreases and relapse risk increases,” wrote Bodyl A. Brand, M.Sc., of the University Medical Center Groningen, the Netherlands, and colleagues. “Higher dosages do not effectively prevent relapse, while they do increase the risk for side effects.... The current study provides evidence that, while accounting for antipsychotic use, augmentation with MHT may provide a better strategy for relapse prevention.”

The researchers analyzed data from 3,488 women in Finland diagnosed with schizophrenia or schizoaffective disorder (SSD) and hospitalized for psychosis who initiated systemic MHT between 1995 and 2017.

The researchers used a within-person study design that compared the rates of health outcomes during periods when the women were taking MHT and periods when they were not. The primary outcome was relapse, defined as hospitalization due to psychosis; the secondary outcome was hospitalization due to any psychiatric reason.

A total of 1,849 women (52.7%) had at least one hospitalization for psychosis during follow-up. Overall, women using MHT were 16% less likely to relapse than those not using MHT. Hospitalization for any psychiatric reason was also lower when MHT was used.

The reduced risk of relapse was greatest for women who started MHT between ages 50 and 55, followed by women who began between ages 40 and 49; there was no reduced risk for women who started between ages 56 and 62.

There were some slight differences in effectiveness among various hormonal formulations. Estradiol alone as well as estrogen plus levonorgestrel, medroxyprogesterone acetate, or norethisterone were associated with between 15% and 25% reduced relapse risk, while estriol, tibolone, and estrogen plus dydrogesterone were not associated with decreased relapse risk. Oral and transdermal formulations appeared to be similarly effective.

“To maximize benefits and minimize risks of MHT, treatment should be individualized using the best available evidence, with periodic reevaluation of continuation,” the authors concluded. “Women with SSD of menopausal age form an exceptional group which is susceptible to psychosis relapse, but also to side effects of antipsychotic medication.... Considering its potential and safety, continued efforts are needed to make MHT more accessible and acceptable in this vulnerable group of women.”



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## **\$15 million in taxpayer funds went to Dr Anthony Fauci's security detail**

## **Prostate Cancer Treatments Carry Substantial Long-Term Risks: Study**

The research, published on Nov. 7 in JAMA Oncology, analyzed data from nearly 52,000 men. Those undergoing prostatectomy, the surgical removal of all or part of the prostate, faced a more than sevenfold increase in the risk of urinary and sexual complications compared with untreated men over 12 years, according to the results.

These complications include urinary tract infection, loss of bladder control, erectile dysfunction, and narrowing of the urethra or the neck of the bladder.

Radiotherapy patients also saw a nearly threefold increased risk of these side effects, as well as a tripled likelihood of developing bladder cancer.

The findings indicate that men who underwent prostatectomy faced a risk of experiencing at least one complication that was more than six times greater than that of untreated participants. Those treated with radiotherapy had a 12-year risk of complications approximately three times greater.

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## **Jury Awards \$12.6 Million to Woman Fired for Not Receiving COVID Vaccine**

The Michigan woman was fired in 2022.

A woman fired by Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan over not receiving a COVID-19 vaccine has been awarded more than \$12 million in damages.

A jury on Nov. 8 awarded Lisa Domski, a former employee of the company, \$10 million in punitive damages.

Jurors also awarded \$1 million in non-economic damages, \$1.375 million in front pay damages, and \$315,000 in back pay damages.

Jurors said that Blue Cross Blue Shield illegally discriminated against Domski when the company denied her request for an exemption from its policy requiring COVID-19 vaccination.

The company also illegally terminated Domski over the lack of COVID-19 vaccination, the jury found.

- Blue Cross Blue Shield said it did not discriminate against Domski and said her religious beliefs were not sincere.

## **Smoking pot makes you age faster and leads to birth defects in your future kids, study suggests**

.Smoking marijuana can alter a person's DNA, accelerating aging and leading to birth defects in their future children. The drug has boomed in popularity over the last decade. It is now recreationally legal in 24 US states and daily use of weed has surpassed that of alcohol.

But new findings have warned of the dangerous health implications, including faster aging, increased cancer risk and fertility problems.

Researchers from The **university of western australia** looked at more than 50 global studies investigating the effects of cannabis use on the body and said the startling statistics should 'reframe the discussion of cannabis legalization.'

Co-author Dr Stuart Reece said: 'This new research shows how genetic damage from cannabis use can be passed down the generations. This should reframe the discussion surrounding cannabis legalization from a personal choice to one that potentially involves multiple subsequent generations.'

They say premature aging is one of the most common effects of marijuana and a recent study found long-time users who were 30 years old showed they had a biological age of 30 percent higher. The study involved **154 participants from a small city in the southeastern US**, who provided blood samples that yielded two indices of epigenetic aging from age 13 to age 29 and at age 30. The blood tests, that **measured chemical tags on DNA**, showed any **INCREASED RISK** of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), type 2 diabetes, ischemic heart disease, and lung cancer.

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
